#### What are the roles?

<u>Coach</u> – Main point of contact.

<u>Assistant Coach</u> – Assists the head coach, but sometimes we have two co-coaches instead of one head coach.

<u>Team Manger</u> – Assist the coaches in the background, which could include organising players on the bench, uploading schedules or communicating with parents.

These roles are referred to as team officials and will work together to support the team. Each team dynamic will look different. Some teams will consist of a coach, assistant coach, team manager, and some teams will consist of three assistant coaches. Whatever works for your group!
